- Question What is the chronological order of these programs? There is not a chronological order - it depends on what you qualify for. If you were at a hospital or doctor - they can look you up and see what program you have.
- Joe also added that we have five branches open for consumers to come in and access help right now.
- Eligibility for in-home support you must qualify financially and functionally.
- Robyn commented: We administer these programs in Multnomah County - the rest of the state does things differently.
- Commissioner Meieran commented: Seems odd in terms of Long Term Care how confusing the licensing of homes are. Joe agreed and here is more info:

Adult Foster Homes in Multco are licensed and inspected by ADVSD's Adult Care Home Program. Nursing Facilities, Assisted Living, and Residential Care Facilities are licensed and inspected directly by the State's Safety, Oversight and Quality division. ADVSD and Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) have consumers in all these settings and have assigned Case Managers.

If there is something that needs to be addressed with the facility, LTSS will always partner with all of these entities to ensure we understand and can

meet the needs of consumers and develop safe plans of care.

- Joe added that an intake case manager has 45 days to make a determination. They have very high caseloads at this time. Potential delays may occur, and some cases may need to be prioritized.
- Alysia commented it would be helpful if the acronyms were on the table in your slides. Also examples would be helpful.
- Dennis asked how many Medicaid consumers are there in the county - Joe said approximately 40,000.
   Of those, about 9,400 are on Long Term Care Services.
- Dennis asked if Idaho has the same Medicaid program that OR does? Joe explained that funding comes from the federal government (with supplemental monies from the state) and some

Managers have been having conversations with staff and discussing what staff will be added. We are hoping to hire about 60 new staff.</li> <li>We are also receiving a small increase in budget for funding to contractors who provide services connected to our Older American Act. At least half of this increase will go for food services.</li> <li>Robyn added that budget increase was helped by the workload study and was driven by the Triple A's and the people we serve as well as our advisory council members.</li> <li>Dennis asked how the 60 new staff will be disbursed? Irma stated they would be in a variety of places and they are Medicaid funded positions. Case managers, adult protective services</li> </ul>

				<ul> <li>investigators, call center staff, and adult care home licensers are all staff we are looking to add.</li> <li>Dennis asked where staff is needed the most - Irma feels like Adult Protective Services is very understaffed.</li> <li>We license our own Adult Care Homes in Multnomah County. We are not at a time that we are reviewing the rules for licensing. A committee has been working on this since spring of 2020. We really try to align our rules with the state's rules. There will be a public comment session on these rules, and we will let you know when this has been scheduled.</li> <li>Robyn commented that maybe there might be a place on this committee that was reviewing the rules for Adult Care Homes.</li> <li>Felicia Nelson - is retiring as the manager of ACHP - Steven Esser is the interim manager at this time.</li> </ul>
