SUBJECT: Child Room and Board Eligibility—County Residency

Multnomah Other contracts with specific providers for Supported Capacity for Dependent Children of Adults in SUD Residential Treatment (AKA Child Room & Board).

After receiving some conflicting information, Multnomah Other was able to determine that a member or their dependent(s) do not need to be residents of Multnomah County to qualify for Child Room and Board funding. Members who reside in other counties, are receiving SUD Residential Treatment in a facility located in Multnomah County, and have full-time custody of dependent child(ren) or need to reunify with dependent(s) are covered for Child Room and Board through Multnomah Other.

All other eligibility (e.g. income level) still apply – providers should review the [Eligibility and Enrollment](#) policy posted on the [AD Provider website](#) for all criteria.

All other support services and all treatment services still require Multnomah County residency for eligibility. Qualification for Child Room and Board does not indicate that the member is eligible for any other services. Providers should ensure that they are not encountering or submitting claims for any treatment or any other support services, other than Child Room and Board.

In addition to documenting their county of residence, providers should document why the member is receiving treatment in Multnomah County, e.g. need a culturally-specific program, need a reasonable accommodation, etc.
