

# WHAT IS AN ERPO?

A court order that:

<u>Prohibits</u> a person from possessing deadly weapons such as firearms <u>for one year</u>

when they present a <u>risk of suicide or</u> <u>causing physical injury</u> to another person

in the <u>near future</u>.

# **EXAMPLES OF GOOD ERPO CANDIDATES**

• A person has threatened or attempted suicide with a firearm.

• A person has made threats to acquire a firearm to harm others.

• A person owns firearms and has made credible threats to harm an individual or group.

# WHO CAN APPLY FOR AN ERPO

- Family member
- Household member
- Intimate partner
- Law Enforcement


What about doctor / social worker/ neighbor?

Nope. (Other states allow doctors / MH providers to apply)



• Deliver paperwork to the Multnomah County Courthouse 8am-noon.



# HOW DO I APPLY FOR AN ERPO?

 Complete and print ERPO paperwork (https://www.courts.oregon.gov/forms/ pages/erpo.aspx, or just google "ERPO Oregon")

• Deliver paperwork to the Multnomah County Courthouse before noon.

The judge will call you that afternoon.



# WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR THE ERPO?

**Community Member** 

First-hand information

Can apply without delay

Sometimes struggle with process

Sometimes struggle to articulate risk

Might not want to be the "bad guy."

<u>Law Enforcement</u>

Second-hand information

Juggling caseloads

Familiar with court processes

Good at articulating risk

Used to being the "bad guy."/



# ERPO GRANTED

What happens next?



**ORDER CONTESTED?** 

• Respondent has the right to contest.

• Hearing typically 21 days out.





ERPO VIOLATED?

• Call 911 in an emergency, or the non-emergency line (503-823-3333) depending on the situation

> • Crime ORS 166.543 (Class A misdemeanor)

> > Law Enforcement can arrest / apply for search warrant



# PORTLAND POLICE'S PROCESS


### • Problem:

- Patrol unfamiliar with process
- Patrol does not have time/resources

### Solution

- Patrol emails ERPO inbox.
- BHU officers complete and submit paperwork.
- Online training for all officers May 2025


The Behavioral Health Unit (BHU) is now available to assist with Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPOs).



How immediate does the risk need to be for an ERPO?
The person must present a risk of suicide or causing physical injury to
another person


