Reconnaissance Survey Not Required

Commission Land Use Ordinances specify when a reconnaissance survey must be conducted before a proposed development can be approved. My evaluation and review indicates that a reconnaissance is not required. This determination complies with the ordinance because the proposed development:

- ☒ Would occur on a site that has been determined to be located within a low probability zone
- ☒ is not within 100 feet of a high probability zone
- ☒ Does not occur within 500 feet of a known archaeological site

Supporting Information:

- ❖ The Management Plan for the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area does not require a reconnaissance survey for projects that occur in areas that have a low probability of containing cultural resources as long as they do not occur within 500-feet of an archaeological site or within 100-feet of a high probability area (Chapter 2 – Cultural Resources, Section 6. A. (6)).

Historic Survey Not Required

The Commission's Land Use Ordinance guidelines specify when a historic survey must be conducted before a proposed development can be approved.

- ☒ Would not alter the exterior architectural appearance of buildings and structures that are 50 years old or older.
- ☒ Would not compromise features of the surrounding area that are important in defining the historic or architectural character of significant buildings or structures that are 50 years old or older.

Supporting Information:

As there is always the possibility that historic or pre-contact cultural materials may be discovered during activities associated with this undertaking, such discoveries are to be reported immediately. The applicant is required to cease work within the immediate vicinity of the discovery and immediately notify the Columbia River Gorge Commission as well as the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office. This condition is intended to protect newly discovered cultural resources.
