REPLY: Code changes proposed Thursday (board meeting) - next year would change; really understand programs. Review CBAC Budget Priorities Survey		Mohammad /Rachel	5:55 PM (15 mins)	 Difficult process to do Ex: services to clients might rank higher than administrative stuff Ray's thoughts: Given budget situation, prioritizing state/federal dollars (low priority), direct services to community higher than administrative things except investment helping reducing costs. Becky's thoughts: Difficult situations; there may be certain programs - they are extremely expensive and are the hardest to make or have a



			 transition plan to take it over. Trimming a little is not a good idea. What are we really good at and what is successful? When we can share and when we can't - clarifying Robert shared cut scenarios are going to be shared on Feb 21st with all the details. Ilyse's thoughts: Mental Health dollars should be outside of DCHS as there are other specialized services because they can be billed differently. Barb: Is it possible where there is overlap with other departments? This is a question we get questioned during meetings with the Chair's Office on budget. Robert: \$8M cut to department Mohammad's idea: Priorities - match them to the cut scenarios and where they fit
