Legislative Priorities Overview and Discussion

Bills for discussion include:

- HB 2002: Converts mandatory minimum sentences for specified felonies other than murder to presumptive sentences.
- HB 2928: Regulates use of chemical incapacitants, kinetic impact projectiles and sound devices by law enforcement agencies.HB 2934: Qualified Immunity
- HB 2936: Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to investigate person's character before accepting person for training and certification as police officer or reserve officer.
- SB 621: Upholds, under certain circumstances, local laws concerning local community oversight board established to oversee disciplinary matters concerning law enforcement officers, notwithstanding collective bargaining laws that require bargaining over such matters.
- SB 593: DPSST Changes
- SB 620: Provides that monthly supervision fee for person under supervision of community corrections program is not automatically required, but may be required by program.

- Measure 110 Impact on Behavioral Health
