

Budget by Fund - \$2,703,991


FY 2023 Adopted to FY 2024 Proposed





6 Year Trend of Significant Funds


FY 2019 Adopted to FY 2024 Proposed






FTE - 6 Year Trend

Significant Program Changes

- Transforming Justice \$150,000 OTO (10009C) to:
 - move implementation to community based organization(s) for leadership and administration
 - provide funds to community members for participation
 - provide outside facilitation and consultation, as needed
 - continue collaboration with government entities



Successes – a few highlights from FY 2023

- Transforming Justice
 - Vision and Core Strategies completed
 - 18 2-hour sessions jump-started implementation planning
 - Three day work session completed to create launch plan
- Launched planning for racial reckoning project
- Ongoing facilitation and monitoring of Justice Reinvestment:
 - Policy management
 - Impact on RED
 - Case backlog
 - Contract and support three victims services programs



Successes – a few highlights from FY 2023

- Applicant for several CJC grants, including MCJRP and four specialty courts
- Launch of years of Safety + Justice Challenge Justice Fellowship:
 - Fellowship goals: meaningfully integrate fellows in criminal justice policy development
 - MacArthur funded support moved from OCI to LPSCC
 - Procurement completed for external agency to help develop curriculum for fellows




Successes – a few highlights from FY23

- Ongoing management of Safety + Justice Challenge pretrial project
 - Public Safety Assessment to launch 6.1.23
 - Upgraded case management system (later this calendar year)
 - Better data, more risk-based decision-making
 - Better community monitoring
- Continued role as national leader for collaborative system change
 - National Network of Criminal Justice Coordinating Councils
 - MacArthur Foundation
 - Square One Project

State/Federal Impacts or Other Policy Issues

SB 1145 state funding:

 Dependent on state community corrections formula; provides LPSCC core mission functions

3194 justice reinvestment:

Dependent on state community corrections formula and CJC grant-making

MacArthur Safety + Justice Challenge funding:

 This year will apply for final, most minimal grant: funds may last at least through 12/2024 to support SJC implementation and evaluation. Ongoing maintenance will be the responsibility of justice partners.
