## **RESOLUTION NO. 2023-09**

- A RESOLUTION relating to Gresham-Barlow School District's (hereinafter "the District") opposition to Portland Water Bureau's proposed water treatment facility in the general vicinity of SE Dodge Park Road and SE Cottrell Road.
- WHEREAS, the District is a Local Education Agency that serves students in East Multnomah County; and
- WHEREAS, the District operates schools in close proximity to the project; and
- WHEREAS, the District operates pupil transportation services in the vicinity of and adjacent to the project; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to ORS 327.043, the District has a legal obligation to provide safe and timely transportation to all students residing between the project and District's schools; and
- WHEREAS, the doctrine of in loco parentis requires the District to ensure the safety and well-being of its students once they enter the District's vehicles and/or properties; and
- WHEREAS, the Portland Water Bureau has failed to meaningfully address the District's myriad safety concerns raised by the project; and
- WHEREAS, the District has not been made aware of any specific plans to mitigate risks to students, families, and District operations; and
- WHEREAS, the District has not been made aware of any specific plans to mitigate the traffic concerns raised by the project; and
- WHEREAS, the District recognizes that the "Good Neighbor Agreement" lacks any specificity to alleviate these concerns.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GRESHAM-BARLOW SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS that the District is opposed to the construction of a water treatment plant in the general vicinity of SE Dodge Park Road and SE Cottrell Road.
