

- **Establish methods for obtaining input on community needs, priorities & satisfaction with services**
- Evaluate the administrative mechanism to ensure that resources are distributed effectively in the community according to the decisions made by the Council.
- Collaborate with state governments to develop Integrated Prevention and Care Plans for responding to HIV in our region, in a coordinated partnership with other planners and community members living with or affected by HIV disease.
