

<p>Mission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Establish priorities & allocation of funds available under Ryan White CARE Act, Part A, based on: documented needs of people living with HIV, cost and outcome effectiveness, priorities of the recipients of services, and availability of other public and private resources. ● Establish methods for obtaining input on community needs, priorities & satisfaction with services ● Evaluate the administrative mechanism to ensure that resources are distributed effectively in the community according to the decisions made by the Council. ● Collaborate with state governments to develop Integrated Prevention and Care Plans for responding to HIV in our region, in a coordinated partnership with other planners and community members living with or affected by HIV disease.
