Housing available to those with very low income (under \$15,000) Source: City of Portland, State of Housing in Portland Report, 2015	Virtually None




51% of Portland households are "Rent-Burdened" (more than 30% of income on housing).


Minimum Wage vs. Affordable Housing Wage







Permanent housing placement and unmet housing need among people experiencing homelessness in Multnomah County (annual, estimated)






*Assumes reduce rate of return to homelessness to 15%
