- Labor trafficking across all industries
 - Some we see: agriculture, dairy, restaurant, housekeeping, hospitality, construction, caregiving...
- Companies prioritizing profit over human safety and wellbeing
- The rise of mainstream exploitive practices along with the cost of living
- Traffickers promising legal immigration avenues that do not exist
- Sex trafficking within domestic relationships
- The overlapping of sex and labor trafficking by the same entity
- Survivors relying on traffickers for housing and necessities
 - Poor or missing credit, wages withheld, family members threatened, documents confiscated, language barriers, only feeling safe within the
