- Staggering statistics about the number of young children in Oregon who use tobacco products
- 57% have smoked by the time they are in the 8th grade
- 65% by the time they are in the 11th grade
- 64% of 18-24 year olds have smoked
- 21% are smokers over 25 years old
- The realization that flavored and menthol products contribute to this rising number
- 2mil kids using cigarettes ½ use menthol
- 7 out of 10 cite flavors as their reason for starting
- 80% started with a flavored product
- Banning could stop 4 out of 5 kids from smoking
