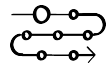

The Multnomah County Justice Fellowship is a pilot program designed to empower individuals with lived experience within the criminal legal system to become active participants in shaping more equitable justice policies. 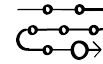

- Active participation in policy-shaping initiatives.
- Financial support (stipends) for fellows.
- Community building and peer support.

Looking ahead

The Multnomah County Justice Fellowship is dedicated to using the valuable insights of individuals with lived experience to create a more equitable justice system. The next program will begin in Fall 2025. The Justice Fellowship Coordinator has already worked with the current cohort to improve the curriculum and will partner with CJS leadership to finalize the 2025 program. Recruitment starts in Summer 2025.
