Brief Overview of the Justice Fellowship:

- **Leadership Development:** Equip community members with knowledge and skills to engage in criminal justice policy discussions.
- **Civic Engagement:** Empower participants to actively participate in shaping public safety policies and programs.
- **Community Expertise:** Develop and foster a diverse network of informed individuals who can contribute to decision-making processes.

Opportunities for Engagement

- **Project Matching:** We have developed a process to connect fellows with projects focused on equity and reducing disparity in the criminal justice system.
- **Support:** LPSCC will offer stipends, coaching, and resources to support fellows in their work.
- **Networking:** We will facilitate ongoing connections and collaboration among fellows.

LPSCC Support

- Reviews proposals, matches Fellows to projects.
- Serves as point of contact for all projects.
- Provides coaching, support and facilitates communication.
- We provide Fellows stipends, but you have the option to match those funds to extend their involvement.
