LPSCC Council Meeting Follow Up 2.24.2025

Context of Pretrial Work in Multnomah County

There are several ongoing large scale initiatives occurring at the same time in our jurisdiction.

Work is happening as part of the Safety + Justice Challenge while agencies are simultaneously responding to statutory, policy, and operational changes. At the highest level, we got here through a series of local, state, and national efforts marked by the following significant milestones:

- HB 3194 (2014) State's Justice Reinvestment Initiative, resulted in the Multnomah County Justice Reinvestment Program (MCJRP) and lays the groundwork for subsequent system reform efforts.
- Safety + Justice Challenge (2015) National foundation initiative funds the implementation of system reform in select jurisdictions.
- <u>SB 48</u> (2021) State's pretrial reform initiative, led to changes in roles and responsibilities for pretrial system partners.
- <u>Chief Justice Order 24-014</u> (2024) Directs release decisions across the state.

Multnomah County's strong collaborative history in pretrial system reform work through the Safety + Justice Challenge meant that stakeholders were prepared to implement sweeping operational changes when Senate Bill 48 was passed. Today, the Safety + Justice Challenge brings Multnomah County a plan for next steps and additional funding to evaluate the changes we as a system collectively implemented over the past decade.
