# **Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes**

Introductions were made.

New LPSCC members were introduced:

The August minutes were approved.

### Announcements:

 Judge Stephen Bushong added a reminder that the Courts Community Conversation event is happening Wednesday, September 12 from 6-8pm in Rockwood. This is in response to the Judicial Listening Sessions and is about Juvenile Justice.

- DA Rod Underhill gave an update on Juvenile Justice Reinvestment and the results from the policy change around Measure 11 Tier 2 for youth. Over 5 years, the average was 18 cases per year. These have been eligible for the Justice Reinvestment Program. Prior to the implementation of the new policy, about 70% of these cases resulted in a prison term. Now with Juvenile Justice Reinvestment (JJRI), 82% now receive probation. However, there is still disproportionate number of cases that come to the District Attorney's Office.
- Rod Underhill noted there will be a HB 2355 report by the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC). The results around Treatment First are positive.
- DA Rod Underhill also announced all Multnomah County Safe Kits have been tested.
   Multnomah County is helping other counties with 1000 cases, and all these will be complete by Friday.
- DA Underhill announced Senior Deputy District Attorney JR Ujifusa has been appointed Chair of the National Advisory Committee on the Sex Trafficking of Children & Youth in the United States. See an announcement here.
- Suzanne Hayden noted the Building Bridges of Understanding in Our Communities is having a <u>summit</u> on October 18th at the Muslim Education Trust.

## Youth & Gang Violence Implementation Plan Updates

Lakayana Drury, <u>Word is Bond</u>, gave a background on Word is Bond. Several POIC interns spoke about the summer internship activities including participating in a mock trial, a "Know Your Rights" Campaign. Wieden & Kennedy help create the videos. A video was shown. There was technical difficulty so the link will be shared electronically.

# New Systems for CSEC (Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children)

- \* System history, changes in the population, challenges with providers, shutting down, and re-booting
- \* The redesign process/community engagement that included research, interviews, site visits, conversations with system partners, and focus groups. New needs identified were mobile community outreach & advocacy, transitional housing for sex trafficking survivors, case management and life skills training, and drop-in day centers.
- \* New providers: A New Day Collaborative includes New Avenues for Youth, Call to Safety, and Raphael House. The presentation shows details on access and services of each.
- \* Relationship between the service system and the larger sex trafficking system.
