




## Multnomah County: Reported Index Offenses




\*The graph reflects the combined weekly index offenses data from Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and Gresham Police Dept (GPD), beginning 8/2004 (line in blue). According to LEADS (2005) data PPB and GPD account for 95% of all offenses county-wide. Index offenses account for about half of all reported offenses.

### Average Daily Reported Index Offenses\*





## Multnomah County: Portland Arrests




\*Other largely reflects fugitive/warrant charges and local ordinances (DFZ/PFZ). PPB data only, downloaded 4-18-2007.

### Average Daily Arrests\*: March (n=90)




\*There were 2,792 arrests in March. Local Charges include drug-free and prostitution free zone violations.

## Sheriff: Bookings




\*In-transit bookings are not reported herein and account for ~4% of all bookings. March's average length of stay (ALS) per booking was 18.68 days.

### Average Daily Bookings by Severity\*: March (n=101)





\*Excludes in-transit custody classifications. The MCSO reported 0 matrix releases for March 2007 (0/day).


### Average Daily Bed Use: March (n=1546)




Average Daily Jail System Capacity=1690. Average Daily Population (ADP)=1546; there were 144 available beds on any given day.

**Notes:** There was a slight increase in reported offenses: the largest increase being in auto theft. The average daily arrests also slightly increased over February, mainly in the 'Other' category. The Average Daily Jail Population continues to drop, from 1618 in February to 1546 in March, resulting in an increase in available jail beds.




## Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes




### Average Daily Received Cases\*: March (n=76)




### Disposition Type by Primary Conviction\*: March 2007






## Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads

**Notes:** A leveling of cases closed occurred in March with Vehicle/DUII crimes falling and property related crimes rising. There was an increase in the number of Adult Community Supervision caseloads in March and a decrease in the number of Juvenile Supervision caseloads with little change in distribution by type.
