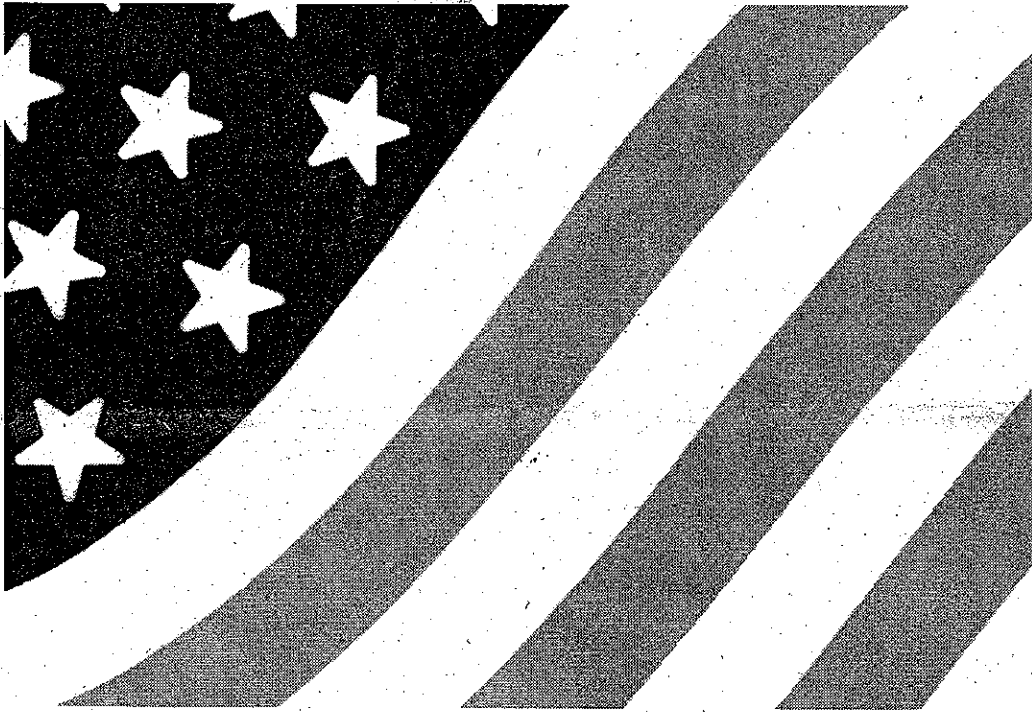

The voters' pamphlet contains candidate and measure information for several districts, but your BALLOT will have only those candidates and measures for the area where you live.

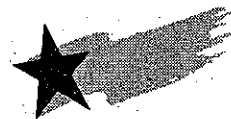

BALLOT TITLE

GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION

QUESTION: Shall the City be authorized to contract a general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$16,000,000? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY: This measure authorizes the City to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$16,000,000. The bonds would mature over a period not to exceed 25 years. Bond proceeds will be used to acquire property (2%), construct a new sewage treatment plant (96%), and construct a laboratory/administrative building (2%). Taxes levied to pay bond principal and interest would also be outside the limitation imposed by section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Troutdale City Council has referred to the voters a proposed \$16 million general obligation bond to construct a new sewage treatment plant.

BACKGROUND:

The City's sewage treatment plant was originally built in 1969 and currently has the capacity to treat about 1.6 million gallons of sewage each day. Our residential and business uses in Troutdale now generate about 1.4 million gallons of sewage daily. We expect increases over the next twenty years to grow to about 3 million gallons a day. If the voters indicate that they do not want to construct a new sewage treatment plant, it will be necessary to expand the existing plant by borrowing \$10,000,000 which would be re-paid from system development charges on new sewage users and increases in sewer rates.

OPTIONS:

Faced with the need to create additional sewage treatment capacity, the City, in partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, examined a range of alternatives. These two seemed to best meet the community's needs:

Option No. 1—Expand the existing treatment plant at its current location in the downtown business district next to the Columbia Gorge Factory Stores, or

Option No. 2—Dismantle the existing plant and construct a new one away from the downtown business area.

Either would adequately treat the projected volumes of sewage. The questions before voters are cost and the future appearance of Troutdale's downtown business area.

In Option No. 1, expansion of the existing plant at a cost of approximately \$10 million leaves the plant in the middle of downtown. Many people believe the plant is unsightly and the source of unpleasant odors. Also, adding on to a plant nearly thirty years old would result in a facility that is not as efficient as a new one, though it does meet the needs for anticipated growth. This is the least expensive of the two options.

In Option No. 2, construction of a new plant away from the downtown business district would cost approximately \$18 million and provide Troutdale with a new plant sized to meet anticipated growth to

buildout. Relocation would alleviate the issues of visual blight and odors in downtown. Also it opens the existing 10-acre plant site to commercial uses, creating jobs, offering business and shopping opportunities, providing access to the Sandy River, and increasing the City's assessed valuation, thus lessening the individual tax burden.

FUNDING:

The proposed general obligation bond would raise \$16 million, which, when added to \$2 million of available City funds, would enable the City to implement Option No. 2. If the bond is approved by the voters, the City would purchase land for a new plant, design and construct a 3 million gallon per day sewage treatment facility and dismantle the existing plant. The debt would be re-paid from system development charges on new sewage users and increases in sewer rates and property taxes.
