




Multnomah County: Reported Index Offenses





Multnomah County: Portland Arrests



Average Daily Reported Index Offenses*




Average Daily Arrests*: May (n=93)





Sheriff: Bookings





Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds






Average Daily Bed Use: May (n=1295)




Average Daily Jail System Capacity=1413. Average Daily Population (ADP)=1295 Range =1244 to 1341.

Notes: Total reported index offenses increased by 1% in Gresham and Portland. Portland Police Arrests have increased 9% since April. For May, a significant increase in arrests occurred in vehicle (18%) and property (16%) arrests. The inmate capacity was reduced from 1539 to 1413 in March, and the percent of beds utilized decreased for the first time to 90.9%. The Average Length of Stay (ALS) has continued to decline since February. From April to May, ALS decreased by 15% to 14.74 days.


District Attorney: Adult Felony Caseload




Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes




Average Daily Felony Received Cases*: May (n=24)




Felony and Misdemeanor Sentences by Primary Charge*: May




Adult Community Supervision: Caseloads




Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads

Notes: The District Attorney's Office experienced a sharp decline in the number of cases disposed between February and March 2008. The Office believes this decline is due to the conclusion of a project that created a temporary spike in the number of disposed cases between September 2007 and February 2008. Average daily adult felony cases received and issued declined for the second month in a row. The caseloads from the CFS and RST services and the Juvenile Counseling services have declined 6% since January 2009.
