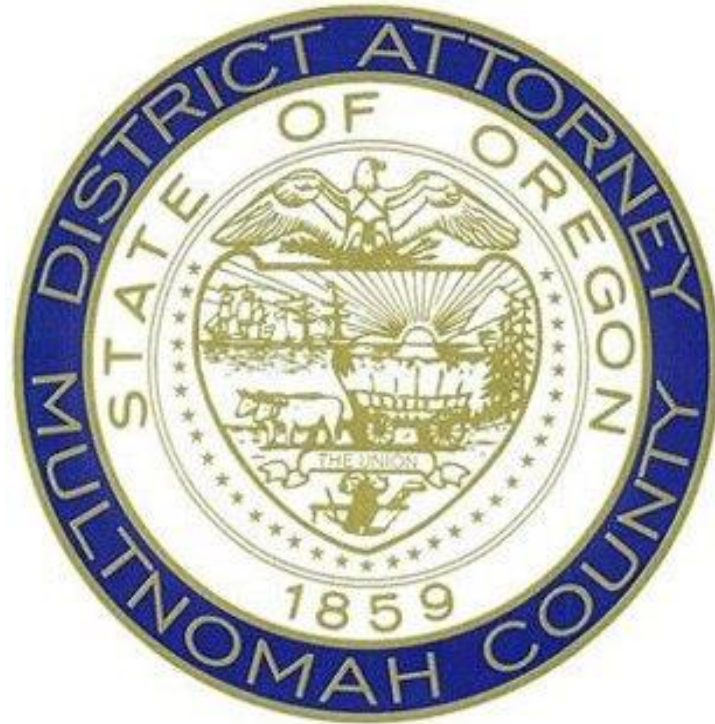

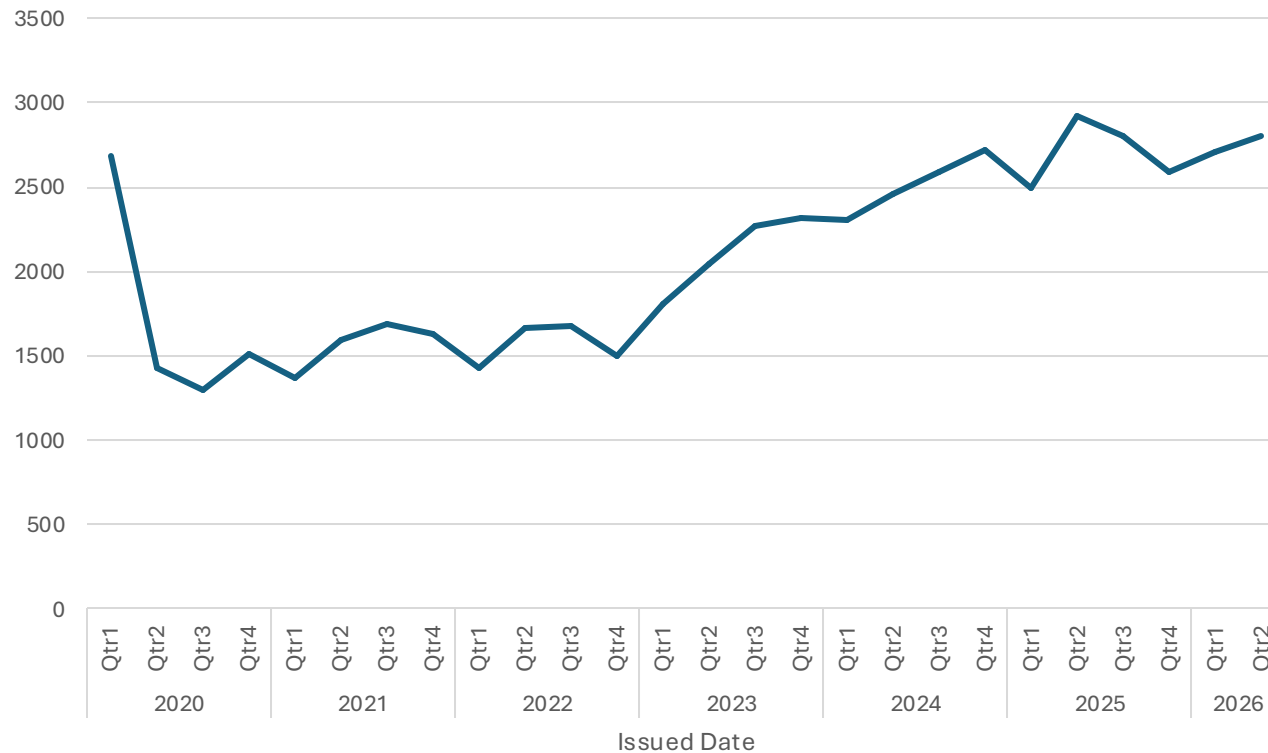

## Issued Cases and Unrepresented Case Counts

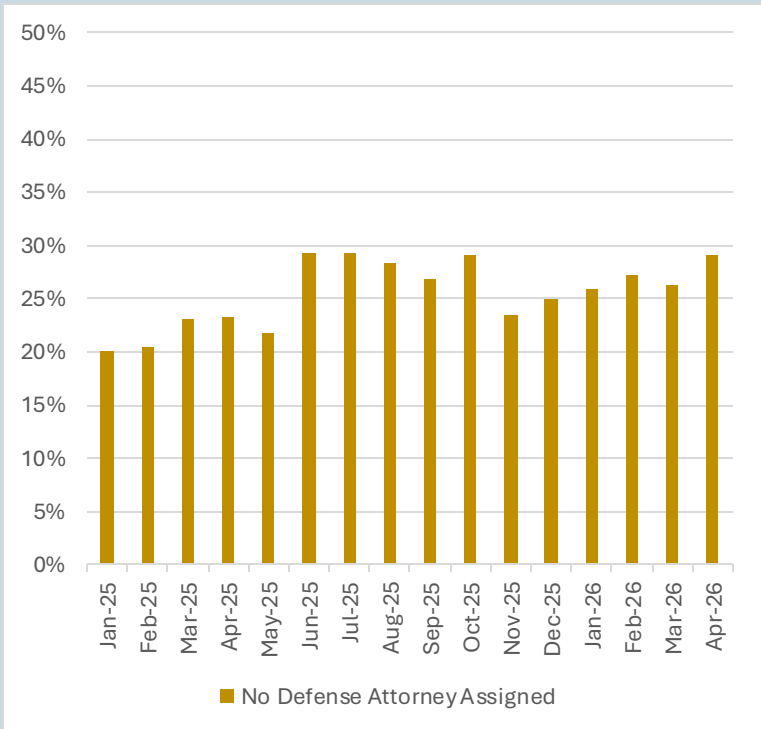
On average, unrepresented cases constitute 25% of MCDA's issued case volume. Issued case counts have increased 117% since the COVID-19 pandemic (Q3 2020 to Q2 2026). This rise in case volume subsequently results in an increase in unrepresented cases.

### Cases with no defense attorney ever assigned

On average, 25% of MCDA cases\* issued between 1/1/2025 and 4/30/2026 have not had any defense attorney assigned.



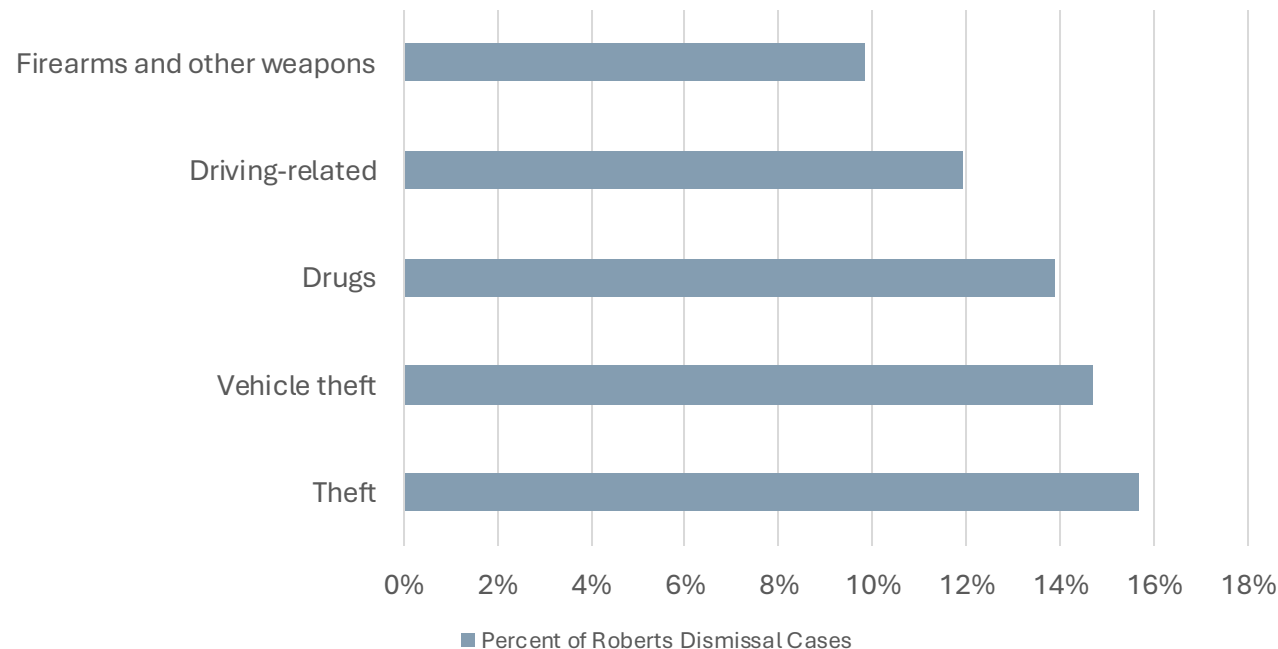

## Roberts Decision Case Dismissals

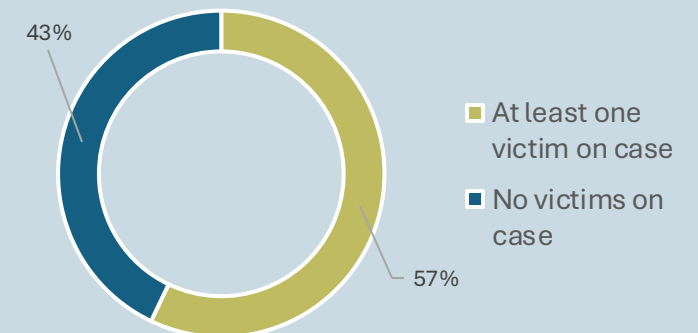
**1,116** Multnomah County adult criminal cases have been dismissed due to defense attorney availability since the Roberts decision.  
(February 2026 to July 12, 2026)

2 of every 3 of the Roberts dismissals cases had a primary charge relating to theft, vehicle theft, drugs, driving-related, or involving firearms.



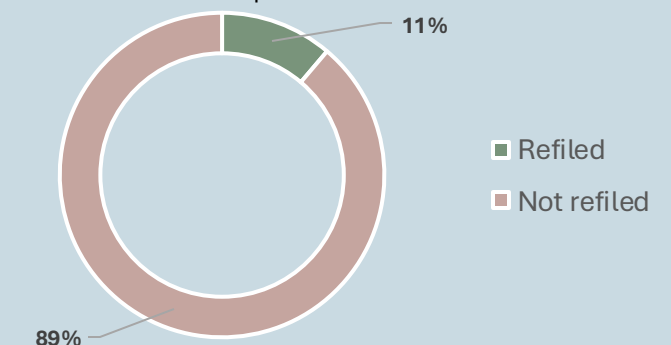
### Roberts dismissed cases with victims

### Roberts dismissed cases refiling

As of 7/12/2026, about 10% of Roberts dismissed cases have been refilled for prosecution





## **Rapid Resolution Docket**

### **Rapid Resolution Docket Eligibility Criteria**

#### **General Requirements**

- The Rapid Resolution Docket is intended for straightforward, solid cases.
- DDAs must recommend Defendant for release

#### **Unit Specific Eligibility Requirements:**

- Property and Narcotics Felonies eligibility is based on sentencing exposure and is limited to Defendants facing MCJRP Track 1 and below
- Robbery, Traffic, and Guns Unit eligibility is based on charged offenses and is limited to Robbery in the Third Degree and some gun charges.
- Assault and Sex Crimes Unit eligibility is based on charged offenses and is limited to some Aggravated Harassments and Failure to Register as a Sex Offender

#### **Ineligible for All Rapid Resolution Offers**

- Open pending person crimes
- Pending DCS (Delivery of Controlled Substance) case
- Pending felony or misdemeanor DUII
- Out-of-county holds, including out-of-county PPS (Post-Prison Supervision) and PVs (Probation Violations)
- No gun minimums

#### **Discretion**

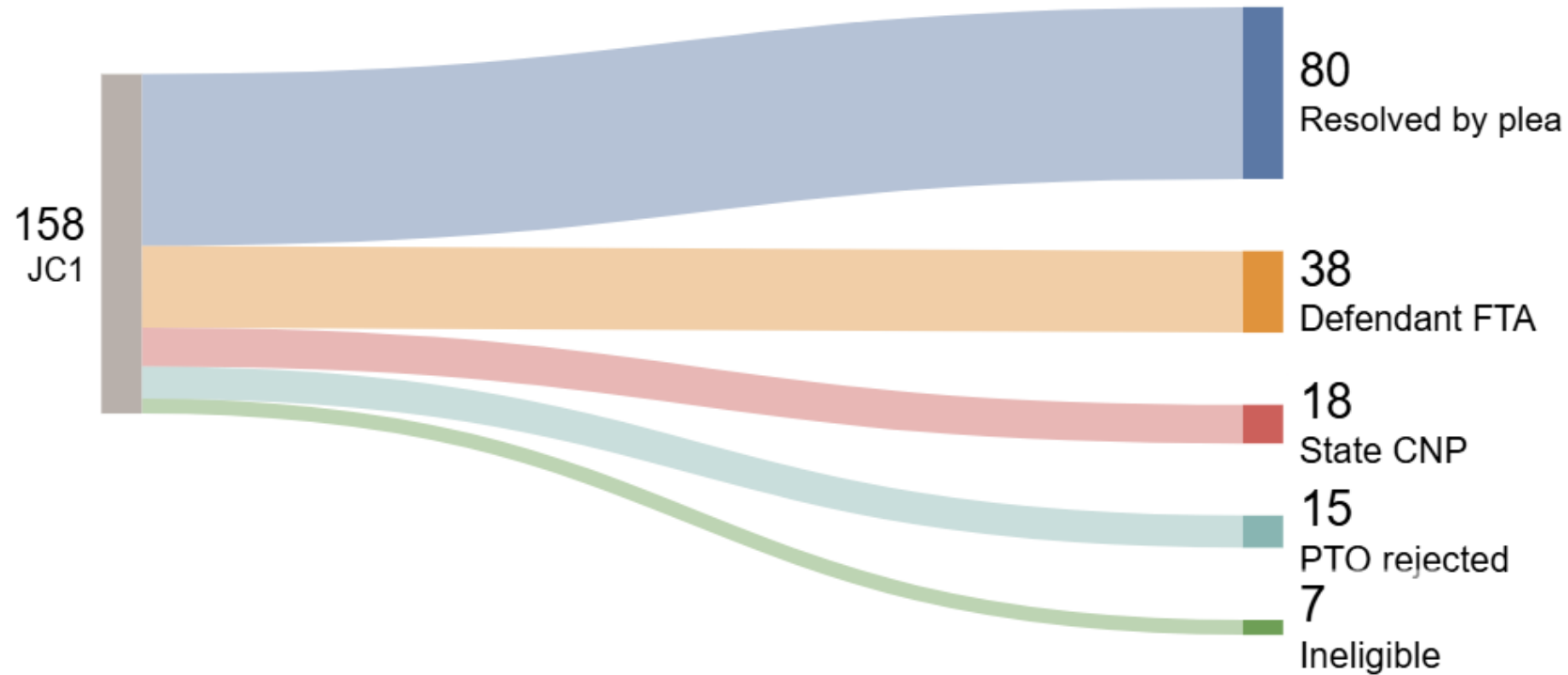
- DDAs are vested with discretion based on the facts of each case reviewed with determining whether to make a Rapid Resolution offer



Rapid Resolution Docket | April - June 2026

158 cases\* have been on the rapid resolution docket since inception. More than half of cases have been resolved via acceptance of plea offer.

Rapid Resolution Docket Hearings

The number of Rapid Resolution docket hearings more than doubled from April 2026 to June 2026. Over two dozen hearings occurred in the first half of July 2026.
