MCSO Fines and Fees for Adults in Custody

- Hygiene Kits (\$9,288 collected in FY22)
 - All adults in custody (AICs) receive a hygiene kit. AICs receive a kit regardless of their ability to pay, and those that are able to pay are charged \$1.95.
- Hearings Fee (\$4,100 collected in FY22)
 - Fee charged per disciplinary hearing conducted at up to \$5 per hearing.
- Disciplinary Fines (\$1,654 collected in FY22)
 - AICs are charged a maximum of \$100 for a disciplinary incident, though typically are charged \$10-15 if charged at all. Fines may include restitution payments.

MCSO Fines and Fees for Adults in Custody

- DNA Samples (\$1,530 collected in FY22)
 - Court-ordered DNA sample at a cost of \$15 per test.

- Copies (\$625 collected in FY22)
 - Adults in custody requesting photocopies are charged 15 cents per copy.
- Printed Acct. Request Fee (\$131 collected in FY22)
 - Adults in custody requesting summaries of their commissary accounts receive them free of charge, but they may pay \$2.25 for a printed copy of all of commissary transactions.

MCSO Fines and Fees for Members of the Public

Alarms Fines and Fees

- Permits, Licenses, and Fees (\$125,291 collected in FY22): New alarm permits and renewals.
- Fines (\$47,845 collected in FY22): Includes fines for operating an alarm without a permit and repeated false alarms.

MCSO Fines and Fees for Members of the Public

- Law Enforcement Records Fees (\$45,177 collected in FY22)
 - Includes fees for new and renewed licenses (liquor licenses, wrecker or dismantler licenses, other permits), vehicle release fees resulting from towed vehicles, and fees associated with report requests (including public records requests.
- Concealed Handgun Fees (\$741,128)
 - Includes initial CHL application fee, replacement fee, transfer fee, and renewal fee (every four years). A portion of these fees go to the State of Oregon, and the bulk of it funds the CHL unit.
