This \$136 million bond is a bad deal for taxpayers. Here's why:

Declining enrollment: Mt. Hood Community College has seen dropping student numbers for years—down 20% from pre-COVID enrollment. Why should we pay for new buildings when there are fewer students? It doesn't make sense.

Too expensive: This bond will cost homeowners \$60 a year. That might not sound like much, but it adds up fast. Over 20 years, that's \$1,200 per household—and that's just for the average home. Many will pay much more.

Bad timing: With prices rising and the Portland region in a doom loop, now is not the time to raise taxes. Many families are struggling to make ends meet.

A retractable pool cover? MHCC is making a big deal about improving the "community pool." While voters struggle to make ends meet, why is renovating a college's pool an educational priority?

Misplaced priorities: In 2023, MHCC spent \$2.4 million to convert the bookstore into an "equity center." How do we know they won't use our tax dollars on other extravagances?
