
The following is the true and complete ballot title of the measure to be submitted to the city's voters on this date:

CAPTION (10 Words) Charter amendment to require vote on new taxes, tax increases.

QUESTION (20 Words) Shall the Wood Village Charter be amended to require a vote on ordinances creating new taxes or increasing existing taxes?

SUMMARY (175 Words) This measure, if passed, would amend Section 39 of the City of Wood Village Charter. It would require the City Council to refer any ordinance creating a new tax or increasing an existing tax to the voters. Such an ordinance would not become effective unless approved by a majority of the city voters at the next regularly scheduled election. Under current law, voters must approve new property tax measures, but the City Council may create or increase other taxes under its own legislative authority, except where otherwise prohibited by state or federal law.
