Recognition Month or Awareness Events (if Applicable)	 Neurodiversity Celebration Week (March 18th-24th) is a worldwide initiative that challenges stereotypes and misconceptions about neurodevelopmental disorders and learning disabilities. National Social Work Month recognizes the dedication and empathy social workers across the country deliver while providing services to children and adults in need. Women's History Month is an annual observance to highlight the contributions of women to events in history and contemporary society. 	
Presenter: Canada Taylor Parker	 Zero Suicide Pilot Project - introduction of survey to assess knowledge, skills and abilities around suicide prevention and intervention. Ask from group and discussion with Canada around offering suicide prevention training to the group in the near future. 	
Presenter: Kevin Fitts	 BHAC was previously AMHSAAC and before that was MEDAC. AMHSAAC = Adult Mental Health and Substance Abuse Advisory Council. MEDAC = Mental and Emotional Disabilities Advisory Council. Jerry Wang and Scott Snedecor's roles as Lived Experience Directors in the 1990's laid the groundwork for integrating consumer and peer perspectives in Multnomah County's mental health services. 	

	 The Lived Experience Director position was cut from the budget in approximately 2002. In August of 2015 Kevin began advocating to reinstate the Lived Experience Director role and/or something similar via public comment and attendance with AMHSAAC. Chair Kafoury included a program offer for the Office of Consumer Engagement in the county budget. The Office of Consumer Engagement now consists of Deandre Kenyanjui (Supervisor), Sadie Campbell (Peer Program Specialist), Roger Garth (Culturally Specific Engagement Coordinator). 	
OCE & Director's Office Updates	 OCE Update: First quarter data pull completed, slides to be presented at upcoming meeting Director's Office Update: We've passed the 30-day mark following the Emergency Declaration. BHD is honored to have Anthony Jordan our Senior Manager of Addictions and Prevention Services in Unified Command with City, State, and County representation to advise action. House Bill 4002 was passed in both houses of the Oregon Legislature and is awaiting signature by Governor Tina Kotek. We anticipate some funding to come to the County to help us establish a Deflection Program which is intended to keep folks cited for drug possession out of jail; there may be other funding as a result of this bill. We are providing contract support to Commissioner Brim-Edwards' work to develop recommendations for a sobering center. A primary driver of this effort is to provide law enforcement with a place other than jail or the ED to take folks.
