The problem

The current commissioners have been running things for years. What is the result? We have declining quality of life, addicts dying in the streets, petty crime going unpunished, rampant vandalism/graffiti, and roads that are nearly impassable. In addition to the damage to personal vehicles, this creates dangerous conditions where emergency services cannot function effectively. Meanwhile, more and more tax revenue is being collected at the county level.

This isn't a question of ideology, but one of competence and priorities.

We need a new direction.

The solution

Instead of embarking on quixotic pursuits that are firmly within the domain of the state or federal governments, the county should be:

- Joining, as an amicus curiae, an appeal of Martin v. Boise and Black v. City of Grants Pass, which together are tying the hands of counties and municipalities in addressing unsafe and unsanitary camps on public property
- Reemphasizing proper road maintenance in the budget
- Encouraging the District Attorney's and Sheriff's offices to undo some of the ill-advised softon-crime policies adopted in recent years
- Exploring new solutions to the homeless mental health crisis, instead of rewarding the nonprofit-industrial complex, possibly revamping the Wapato Jail as a secure drug treatment facility
- Concentrating on the core functions of county government

The challenges

I am under no illusion that any of this will be easy to accomplish, in the face of powerful entrenched interests, who will fight any real reforms. Nevertheless, we need someone to stand up to the powers that be. Should I prevail, I would be honored to represent you, and provide a voice on the board against this dysfunctional system that wastes your tax dollars and fails to serve you.

I humbly ask for your vote.

Let's start the long process of fixing our broken county government and bringing some order to the chaos.
