

Multnomah County's 10 Departmental CBACs

#1: Department of Community Justice CBAC

Provides supervision and treatment to youth, adults, families, and communities. Programs include Adult Services, Juvenile Services, Crime Victims Services, and Family Court Services.

#2: Department of Community Services CBAC

Programs include Elections Division, Animal Services, Land Use Planning, and Transportation. Maintains county roads and bridges.

#3: Department of County Assets & Department of County Management CBAC

The Department of County Assets manages computer systems and software, buildings and property, mobile devices and telephones, a fleet of vehicles, and archives; also provides budget and finance services. The Department of County Management provides the corporate level management of the county's administrative infrastructure: paying the county's bills, HR management, administering property taxes, and creating the budget.

#4: Department of County Human Services CBAC

Programs, services, and funding to provide stability for people across the lifespan. Includes Aging, Disability & Veterans Services, Intellectual & Developmental Disability Services, and Youth & Family Services.

#5: District Attorney's Office CBAC

Responsible for prosecuting offenders who commit state criminal law violations in Multnomah County. Provides victim services & works with community partners on crime prevention.

#6: Health Department CBAC

Provides primary care, dental, and mental health and addiction services to children, adults, and families. Also provides food service inspection and licensing, vector control, and public health education and information.

#7: Homeless Services Department CBAC

Oversees delivery of services to people experiencing homelessness. Shared commitment between Multnomah and the City of Portland. Administers contracts, conducts homeless street counts, one-night shelter counts, and manages systems of care.

#8: Multnomah County Library CBAC

Provides physical and digital material to support informational, educational and recreational needs of the community. Also provides classes, events, storytime programs for youth, public meeting space, resources for educators, jail services, resume assistance, and more. **Please note the Library CBAC recruits participants from their internal volunteer program.*

#9: Multnomah County Sheriff's Office CBAC

Provides prevention, intervention and detention services to the county. Patrols county districts and waterways, and provides police services to unincorporated Multnomah County, Wood Village, Maywood Park, Troutdale, Fairview, and Corbett.
