



# SAFETY PRIORITY BRIEF: NOVEMBER 2007

## Multnomah County: Reported Index Offenses




\*The graph reflects the combined weekly index offenses data from Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and Gresham Police Dept (GPD), beginning 8/2004 (line in blue). According to LEADS (2005) data PPB and GPD account for 95% of all offenses county-wide. Index offenses account for about half of all reported offenses.

### Average Daily Reported Index Offenses\*





## Multnomah County: Portland Arrests




\*Other largely reflects fugitive/warrant charges and local ordinances (DFZ/PFZ). PPB data only, downloaded 12/12/07.

### Average Daily Arrests\*: November (n=86)





## Sheriff: Bookings




\*In-transit bookings are not reported herein and account for ~4% of all bookings. November's average length of stay (ALS) per booking was 20.19 days.

### Average Daily Bookings by Severity\*: November (n=95)





\*Excludes in-transit custody classifications. The MCSO reported 23 matrix releases for November 2007.


### Average Daily Bed Use: November (n=1569)




Average Daily Jail System Capacity=1633. Average Daily Population (ADP)=1569; there were 64 available beds on any given day.

**Notes:** Average Daily Reported Offenses continues its steady decrease with the week ending 11/24/07 experiencing the lowest average daily value since August 2004. This was driven by a decrease in the "Larceny from Auto" and "Larceny Other" categories. The jail bed utilization rate increased to 96.1% from last month's low of 94.5%. Increases in the "Hold/Other" and the "Pre-Trial Felony/Drugs" categories were responsible for much of this rebound.


## District Attorney: Adult Caseload




## Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes




### Average Daily Received Cases\*: November (n=72)




### Disposition Type by Primary Conviction\*: November 2007






## Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads

**Notes:** Average Daily Received Cases decreased 5.3% from October with 72 for November. This was driven by a decrease in the "Behavioral" and "Property" categories. There has been a steady increase in the total average daily cases closed since December 2006 with an average monthly increase of 1.22 cases closed per month since that time. This increase has been driven by increases in the "Dismissed" and "Not Convicted" categories with a more recent increase in the "Convicted" category.
