Opioid Overdose Kit - Daily Checks Monthly Log

MCAR 023-080-576: Adult care homes in Multnomah County licensed to serve residents whose placements and services are authorized by the Behavioral Health Division (BHD) must ensure at least one unexpired opioid overdose kit for emergency response to suspected overdose is available in the home at all times. Opioid overdose kits do not require a prescription and are not specific to an individual (see ORS 689.684). (b) Opioid overdose kits must be installed: (1) In an easily accessible, highly visible, and unlocked location; (2) At a height of no more than 48 inches from the floor; (3) In a location without direct sunlight; (4) In an area where temperatures are maintained between 59°F and 77°F; and (5) And must have a sign clearly indicating the location and content of the kit. Administration of short-acting, non-injectable, opioid antagonist medication must be documented by the ACH staff member who administered the medication. Documentation must be submitted to the Oregon Health Authority within 48 hours of the incident. See MCAR 023-080-576 (g) (1-8) for details.

Provider Instructions: Use this form to provide specific information about the Opioid Overdose Kit (OOK) available in the home to be used for emergency response for suspected overdose, and to document daily checks of the kit components. Start a new log form each month. If the kit is used and/or is missing components, it should be restocked immediately.
