






Community Listening Sessions

Feedback from Focus Groups

- Strong support for Safe Routes to School
- There is a need for more street lighting
- Desire for better connection between neighborhoods
- Need for traffic calming
- Desire for more sidewalks
 - "I walk a lot and don't feel very safe because there are not a lot of sidewalks. I get scared sometimes when it starts getting dark, thinking like, 'oh gosh hope no one hits me.'"

Where in East Multnomah County would benefit from transportation safety improvements? What are the areas, intersections, or streets that feel unsafe?




Barriers to transportation



How safe do you feel...







What are your top safety concerns?





What are your top behavior concerns?







Safety Goal Setting – Introduction



- Requirement of SS4A funding
- Needs to include a goal and timeline for eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries
- Achieved through, one or both, of the following:
 (1) the target date for achieving zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries

(2) an ambitious percentage reduction of roadway fatalities and serious injuries by a specific date with an eventual goal of eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries.
