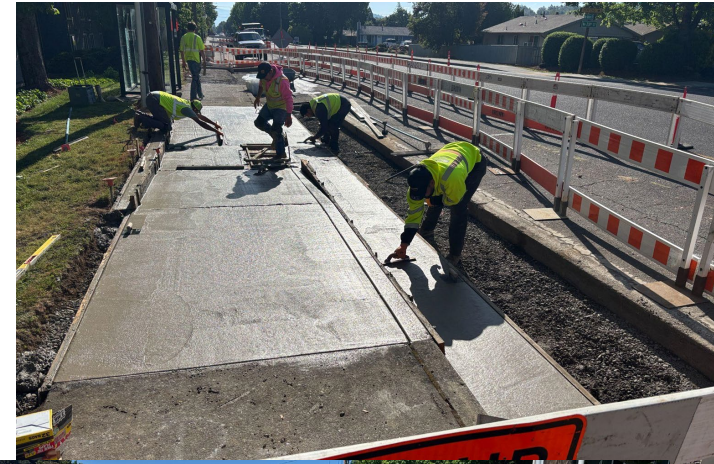

- Construction significantly completed by beginning of Sept before school starts

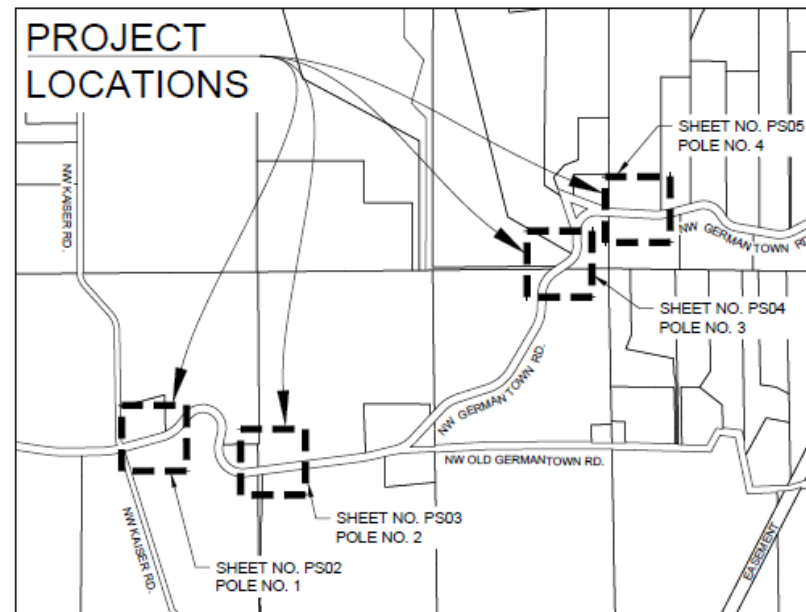

- Construction should start in June and be completed by August 31st

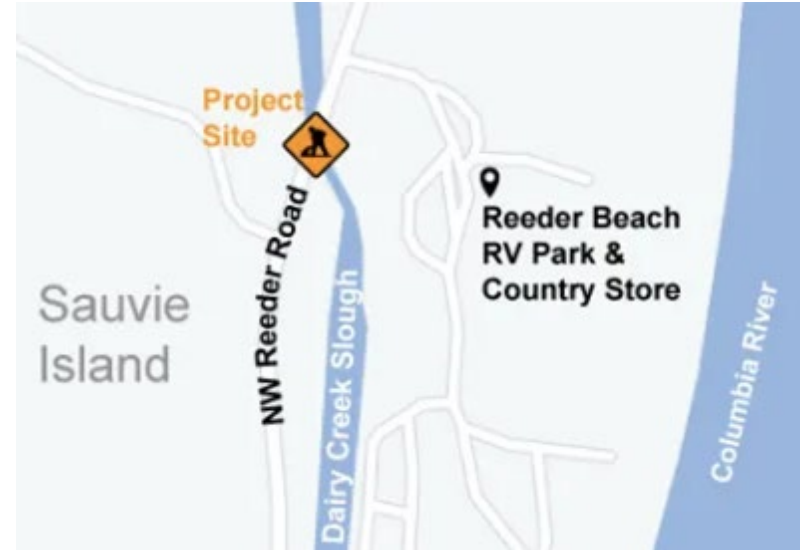

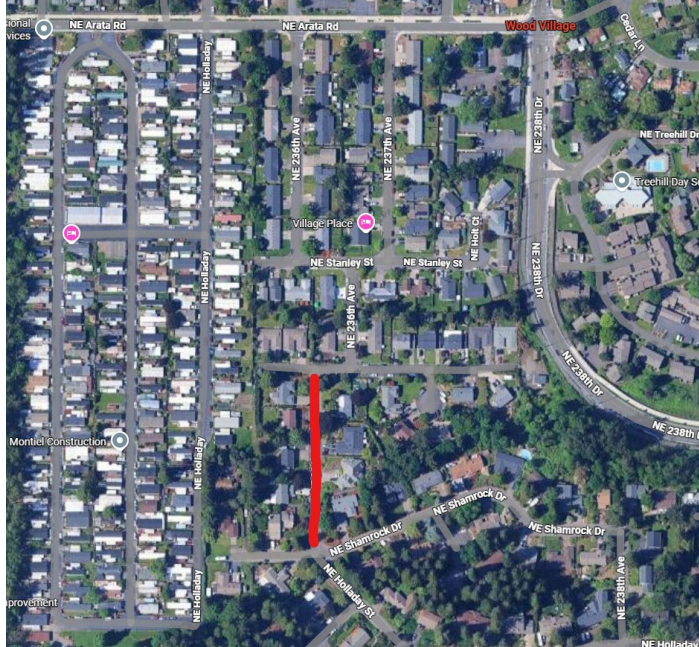

Transportation Projects Summer 2026 East County Cities

City of Wood Village

- Rebuild of 236th
- ~ 500ft of roadway
- Remove current asphalt, regrade the crown, and add additional catch basins
- Crack and slurry seal additional neighborhood streets



City of Fairview

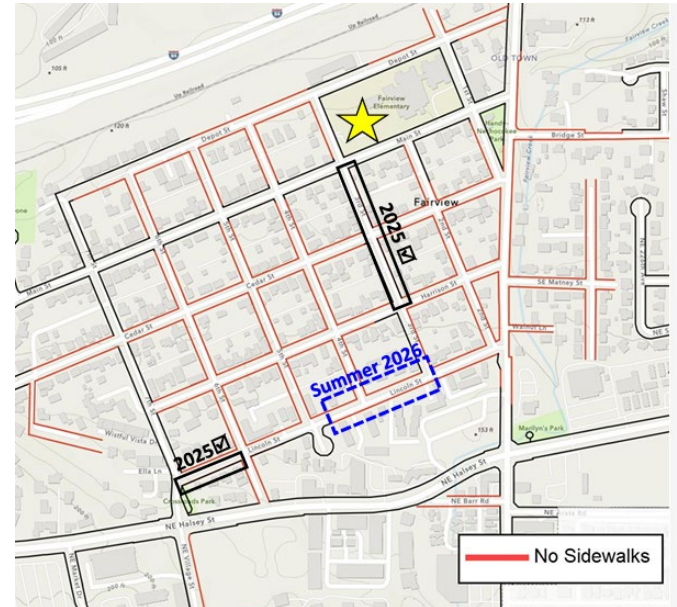
Lincoln Street Sidewalks

- Add sidewalks, planter strip, street trees on south side of the street
- Complexities due to existing street usage
- Late summer/early fall construction



Ongoing Historic Fairview neighborhood sidewalk infill project

- Connections to Fairview Elementary School
- Many sidewalk gaps remaining



City of Gresham

- Gresham-Fairview Trail Phase 4
 - Connects Halsey to Sandy
 - Adds sidewalk on Halsey from 201st to west
- Cleveland Avenue, Stark to Burnside
 - Continues complete street from Burnside to Stark, adding sidewalks and RFFBs
- Yamhill Sidewalk Infill
 - Builds sidewalk on Yamhill west from 182nd to Rockwood Central Park
- Palmquist Sidewalk Infill
 - SRTS project near Hogan Cedars and Springwater Trail
- Traffic Calming for Davis and Hollydale Schools
 - Speed humps added, SRTS funding
- Installation of Five (5) Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs)
- Marine Drive Trail (Metro)
 - Between NE 185th Drive and NE Interlachen Lane
