PROCLAMATION NO. 62

Proclaiming April 30th as Vietnamese-American Remembrance Day in Multnomah County.

Multnomah County Finds:

- A. Vietnamese refugees have proudly resided in the county of Multnomah, the state of Oregon since the conclusion of the Vietnam War on April 30, 1975; and
- B. Vietnamese Americans have put forth their full toiling energy building the county of Multnomah, the state of Oregon in a multitude of prominent areas including industry, economy, culture, education, and military service; and
- C. Vietnamese Americans have counted on the State of Oregon as being their second heart, mind, and family homeland; and
- D. Every year, Vietnamese Americans celebrate Remembrance Day on April 30th to solemnly honor the 58,000 American soldiers that included 810 Servicemen and Servicewomen from state of Oregon, and more than 300,000 South Vietnamese soldiers who sacrificed their lives in the line of duty for freedom and democracy in South Vietnam from November 1955 to April 1975.

- 1. This April 30th 2026 and each year here after to be Vietnamese-American Remembrance Day.
