Amendments related to community members

Proposed Amendment	Proposed by
Add to 3.1(16) At least five members of the community at large, appointed by the County Commissioners (5 should be the standard.)	Terrence Hayes
Add to 3.1(16) “At least two members and no more than three members of the community at large, appointed by the County Commissioners.”	Commissioner Brim-Edwards
Add 3.3 “Priority consideration will be given to community-members residing in East County with lived expertise in the justice system and/or work with justice-involved individuals.	Commissioner Brim-Edwards
Add 3.3 “Priority will be given to individuals with direct lived experience of the justice system, including those who have experienced harm or loss, and those who have navigated system involvement personally or within their families, with consideration also given to those who work closely with impacted individuals or communities. ”	Rhea DuMont

Add 3.1 (15) At least two non-profit victims services providers, appointed by the County Commission.	Rhea DuMont
Combine 3.4(a) and (b) to read 3.4(a) “A representative from the Oregon State Police and a representative from the Oregon Youth Authority shall have permanent, non-voting positions on the Council. The LPSCC Chair shall request those agencies provide the names of those representatives. The Chair may delegate this responsibility to the Executive Director.”	Commissioner Brim-Edwards

Add 3.4(b) “One member who is associated with an academic institution and who has research experience in criminal justice or a related field, appointed by the County Commissioners.”	Commissioner Brim-Edwards
