Welcome to the Public Safety Trends Summary Report produced by Multnomah County's Local Public Safety Coordinating Council (LPSCC). The purpose of this report is to provide an executive level summary of operational data for many of the decision points in the County's Public Safety System for the Council's Executive Committee, partner agency staff, and members of the public.

The statistics detailed in this report are sourced from the County's Decision Support System – Justice data warehouse (DSSJ). The data contained in DSSJ is sourced from the host agency systems and is regularly audited for accuracy. Additionally, the data presented in this report is regularly reviewed by the owner agency analysts for consistency and clarity.

The Report provides both long-term trend data and short-term descriptive statistics. The long-term trends section provides a description of how certain types of events, case types, and charge levels have changed over time. The short-term trends section provides a more detailed description of the data presented in the long-term trend section. Measures of reported Incidents, Arrest, Disposition, and Sentencing are reported at the case unit level. Measures for Booking and Custody are reported at the person level.

The Public Safety Trends Report is produced on a regular basis and serves as a starting point for broader investigations of trends in local public safety. Frequently, the Report will contain a special analysis section providing a systems perspective of specific areas in the local public safety system.

Items of Note and Updates


Reported Part 1 crime during January 1, 2014 – June 30, 2014 was up over 6% in Multnomah County when compared to the same time period in 2013. During this time period there were fifteen reported homicides in 2014 compared to ten in 2013.

Since March 2014, there was a decreasing trend in average daily arrests, bookings, and reviewed prosecution cases. Reported Part 1 offenses alone only decreased slightly during the same time period. However, reported Part 1 and Part 2 offenses together decreased by an average of ten fewer incidents per day.




Average Daily Part 1 Offenses for June 2014








Average Daily Arrests by Charge Level*



Average Daily Arrests by Type in June 2014*











