## **Response 2.15.24**

This is a list of data Commissioner Brim-Edwards has requested from the Fentanyl Emergency Response Team

Multnomah County will clearly articulate baseline data for key indicators relating to Fentanyl use in the County, including but not limited to:

1. Prevalence of Fentanyl use, broken down by demographic information including age, race, ethnicity, indigenous, LGBTQIA+, housed vs. unhoused, people with disabilities, Veterans
2. Number of existing residential treatment slots
3. Number of outpatient treatment slots
4. Number of partial hospitalization and intensive outpatient slots
5. Number of recovery transitional housing slots, including short-term (less than 6 months), medium-term (6-12 months), and long-term (greater than 12 months)
6. Number of shelter beds available throughout the County
7. Number of recovery-based shelter beds throughout the County
8. Number of overdoses with Fentanyl suspected as the sole or a contributing factor in 2023 and January 2024 with the geographic distribution of the overdoses
9. Number of deaths with Fentanyl suspected as the sole or a contributing factor in 2023 and January 2024 with the geographic distribution of the deaths
10. Quantified estimated need for naloxone
11. Number of individuals receiving naloxone administered by a first responder (EMS, outreach worker, Portland Fire and Rescue, PPB, or other) with the geographic distribution of the naloxone administered
12. Number of successful opioid overdose reversals using naloxone with the geographic distribution
13. A heat map of suspected overdose deaths in the past twelve months with a geographic distribution
14. Number of sobering slots currently available and any restrictions on use

15. Number of individuals started on medication-assisted treatment in the past year
