RESOLUTION NO. 2023-086

Adopting the 2023 Multnomah County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. The Federal Stafford Act requires the creation of a local natural hazard mitigation plan.
- b. The plan describes people and places within the County and recognizes people and places are differently situated and therefore are differently impacted by hazards.
- c. The plan analyzes groups of natural hazards that have historically occurred in the County and makes a projection of where such hazards may occur in the future, including projections based on climate change science.
- d. The plan takes into consideration County activity in the areas of land use planning, transportation planning, facilities and property management, infrastructure planning, equity and sustainability.
- e. The plan determines the magnitude of damage that such future hazards may inflict.
- f. The plan determines what infrastructure(s) are at risk of such hazards.
- g. The plan describes mitigation projects which, when carried out, will lessen the chance for damage or destruction due to natural disaster or emergency.
- h. The plan allows the County to apply for Federal pre- and post-disaster natural hazard mitigation funding.
- i. This plan updates the plan previously adopted by Resolution 2017-091.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:

1. To adopt the attached 2023 Multnomah County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan has been approved by FEMA pending local adoption, so will become effective immediately.
