RE: Pipeline Installation and Road Closure - Intersection of SE Lusted & SE Altman

Jon,

Multnomah County Transportation Planning and Development received the attached request from the Portland Water Bureau (PWB) to complete work related to pipeline installation at the intersection of SE Lusted Road & SE Altman Road from Monday, December 2nd, to Friday, December 13th, between 7 am to 6 pm, Monday-Saturday. The work will require full closure of the intersection during work hours. The intersection will be opened to regular traffic at the end of each work day and on Sunday, December 8th.

Staff has conditionally approved the work with the following conditions:

- Contractor must comply with all other conditions in the Multnomah County Construction Permit;
- Access to adjacent properties and for emergency services must be maintained to the extent possible. [Multnomah County Road Rules 13.500];
- Notify residents along the project route and share information in the weekly construction update.

Approval is requested per authority granted the Director by ORS 203.035, ORS 368.011, and MCC 29.503, MCC 29.583.

RE: Bull Run Filtration Project – Pipelines Road Closure SE Lusted and Altman Rd

This memo provides an overview of a proposed road closure, as defined under Multnomah County Road Rules (“MCRR”) 13.100, needed to construct the Bull Run Filtration and Pipelines Project. The closure will meet the Conditions of Approval (“COA”) of the Hearings Officer’s Decision in Multnomah County Land Use Case File T3-2022-16220 (the “Decision”), including the COAs under “Additions to County Transportation Condition 7” on pages 86-88 of the Decision. As applicable, those COAs are included in the approved permit set and in the contract documents between Portland Water Bureau (PWB) and its contractors.

Detailed below is the proposed closure location and duration to complete the subject work at the intersection of SE Lusted and Altman Road. The closure is anticipated to occur beginning the week of December 2 through December 13, between 7 am to 6 pm Monday-Saturday. If needed, Saturday work is requested so that work can be completed more quickly to reduce disruption to the community. At the end of each workday and on Sundays, the intersection of Lusted and Altman will be open to regular traffic.

The scope of work within the Multnomah County right-of-way includes the following:

- **Item 1 Lusted/Altman Intersection:** Saw cutting and removal of asphalt, excavation, shoring installation (if required), pipe installation, backfill, testing, and commissioning for Pleasant Home Water District

Road Closure Schedule by Location (see Figure 1)

1. **SE Lusted and Altman Intersection** (Station 599+60 to 641+70)
 - 12/2-12/13 closed 7am-6pm*/9 days

Multnomah County Road Rules (MCRR)

MCRR 13.450 states that “requests for closure of twenty-four (24) hours or more must be submitted at least 14 days before the proposed closure. Public notice will be required for closures of more than twenty-four (24) hours.” PWB shared the request for the subject road work with County Transportation in recent bi-weekly meetings and in a separate email on September 30, 2024.

PWB canvass property owners the week of November 11, 2024, along the project route and shared maps of the work areas and a general description of the work. Additionally, PWB shared information about the work at a quarterly update provided to the community on October 10, 2024, in PWB’s weekly construction updates to the public since October 11 (including Emergency Responders), weekly on its project website, and with the Gresham-Barlow School District’s Student Safety Committee in recent meetings and via email.
