



### **Elected Officials**



















The Chair and Commissioners are elected to four-year terms on non-partisan ballots. The Chair is elected to serve at-large. Commissioners are elected from west, north, central and east geographic districts based on population.

The District Attorney, Sheriff, and Auditor are also elected positions. Like Commissioners, they too serve 4-year terms.

## **GROUP ONE: Role of the Chair**



- Became chair on January 1, 2023
- Presides over Board of County Commissioner meetings (agenda, facilitation, etc.)
- Serves as Chief Executive and "CEO" for the County; "the buck stops with her"; executes contracts, proclamations, ordinances, policies, etc. on behalf of the County
- Oversees and administers all County programs, except those under the other electeds (Sheriff, Auditor, and DA)
- Proposes the initial Chair's Budget to the other County Commissioners
- Collaborates with other governments in the County and in the region (including Metro)

## **GROUP TWO: Role of County Commissioners**









The County Commissioners serve as the county's primary legislative and policy-making body.

They review, amend, and adopt the county budget, and oversee county departments and administrative structure.

They act as liaisons to advisory boards and commissions, adopt policies and labor agreements, and shape county priorities.

They hold regular public meetings and deliberate on ordinances, orders, proclamations, and county business.

## **GROUP THREE: Role of District Attorney**



### **District Attorney: Nathan Vasquez**

- 1. Responsible for enforcing criminal law; the DA is in charge of managing the Office
- 2. Increase and maintain public safety through compassionate accountability, empowerment of crime victims, and community collaboration
- 3. Community collaboration through crime prevention and public safety initiatives
- 4. File cases, negotiate plea deals, present cases in court on behalf of government, manage diversion programs (e.g., drug and mental health court)

### **GROUP FOUR: Role of Auditor**



- Analyzes effectiveness of government programs
  - Financial and performance audits
  - Reports and recommendations
- Focus on large, high cost, or public facing programs
- May focus on entire department or specific programs
- Operate independently
- Host Good Government Hotline and Ombudsman
