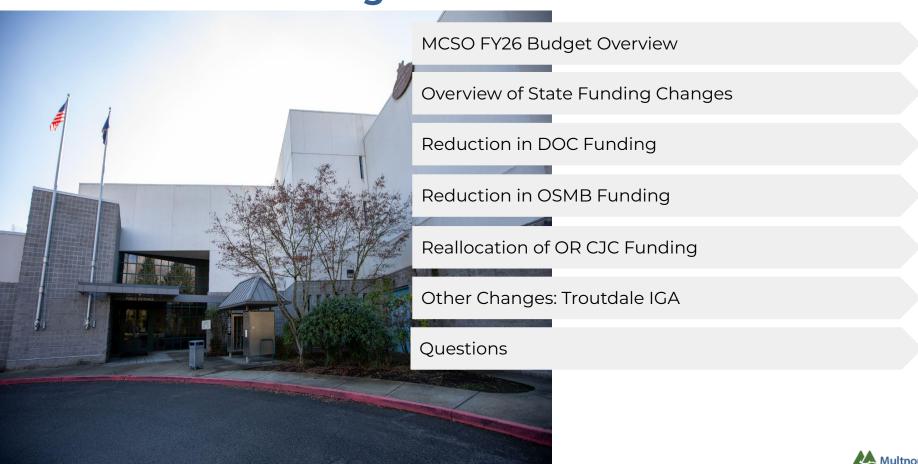

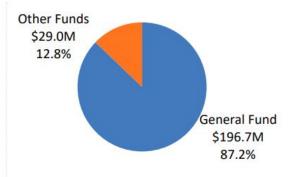

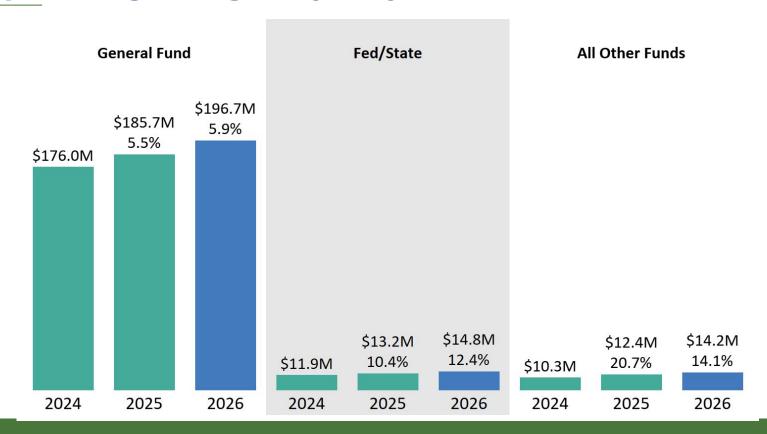

Operating Budget by Major Fund





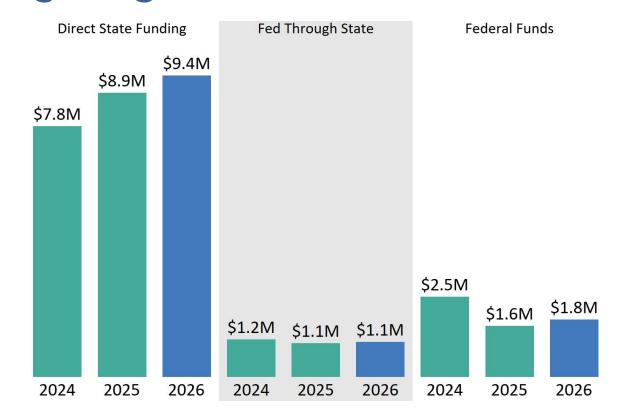
FTE Trend FY 2022-2026





MCSO Operating Budget: State/Fed Revenue

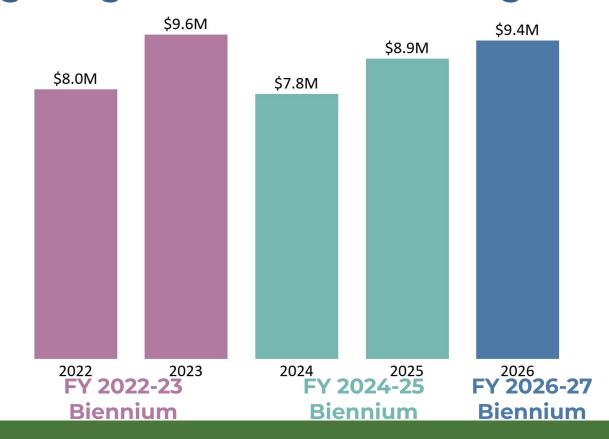
5.5% of MCSO's FY 2026 Adopted budget is Fed/State Revenue

Overview of State Funding Changes

- \$1.4m reduction in annual funding from Oregon Department of Corrections (SB1145)
- \$283,394 reduction in annual funding from Oregon State Marine Board
- TBD increase in funding from Oregon Criminal Justice Commission (MCJRP/HB3194)

Reduction in Oregon DOC **Funding**

-\$1,405,272

- Funding from State Department of Corrections, established with SB1145, supports County jail beds
 - Funds OR counties to manage offenders locally in lieu of or following State prison sentences
- MCSO reduction is part of a larger County reduction also impacting the Department of Community Justice
- County will need to allocate ongoing funding or reduce jail bed count

Reduction in Oregon State Marine **Board Funding**

-\$283,394

- Oregon State Marine Board funds MCSO Deputy Sheriffs assigned to River Patrol
- Loss of funding would have been equivalent to roughly 2.00 Deputy Sheriff FTEs
- MCSO will cover this reduction in its FY 2026 budget by reducing supply budgets; no operational impact is anticipated

Reallocation of Oregon **Criminal Justice** Commission **Funding**

Amount TBD

- Forthcoming transfer of work of the Inverness Jail Treatment Readiness Dorm from the Department of Community Justice to MCSO
- Funds will support Corrections Counselor FTE, though specific funding and FTE amounts are not yet determined
- Reallocation of funds will occur in a subsequent FY 2026 Budget Modification

Other Changes: Troutdale IGA

- MCSO provides policing services to the City of Troutdale through an intergovernmental agreement
- New 2025-2028 agreement results in an increase funding of \$1,366,119 for FY 2026
- Increased revenue pays for personnel costs associated with the IGA, but does not recover full costs of contracted services
